Please welcome Geoff Allen, our November Demonstrator and a respected professional with a passion for painting plein air.

After receiving his bachelor's degree in economics, (while deciding what would come next) Geoff enrolled in a postgraduate summer watercolor class. The experience painting plein air in the Sierras turned out to be a pivotal experience for him! He earned a BA from UC Santa Barbara and an MFA from Claremont Graduate School 1990. He is an active member of San Diego Watercolor Society, California Art Club, and the Laguna Plein Air Painter Association. His career has taken many forms, including contemporary art, modern art, abstraction, conceptual, performance, installation, illustration, folk art, and commercial.

His current move to teaching and painting plein air has been a natural evolution. Geoff says, "As an artist, plein air painting allows my art to showcase two of my greatest passions: my enthusiasm for being outdoors and the beauty of watercolor. Plein air painting helps me focus intensely on my work while promoting a sense of mystery and spontaneity.

In the studio, we practice our art within an open time constraint. In a plein air practice we are vulnerable to time, the whims of nature, and the social environment around us. I love that aspect of art making, when something is slightly out of my control and a challenge. It allows me to feel that I am playing with mysterious forces beyond my own understanding."


Several CVWS members were spotted in attendance at the Desert Art Center's two-show, gala season opening evening in October.

Yes – next year's show seems a long way away, but planning is well under way. Last year we had the best sales ever and this year we have four sales days, one more than last year.

We need the support of our members in several ways. Firstly, we encourage you to paint and enter your work in one or more of the four categories: Traditional, Open, Plein Air or Mini Masterpieces. If you have never entered a show before, be brave and enter; we have a special award for Emerging Artists. Please tell all your friends and neighbors about the show. A CVWS Member Contribution:

Watercolor Granulation

When I set up my watercolor palette, I prefer granulating colors whenever possible. If you aren't familiar with granulation, it is when a pigment separates into the individual colors used to make that formulation. You need to use a lot of water or add granulating fluid for best results. For example, Cascade Green by Daniel Smith, will separate into the blue and green pigments that make up that tube color. The effect adds variety to the hue and is stunning. Unfortunately yellows and reds don't granulate. If you want to test your colors create a big test swatch and add a lot of water or granulating fluid, then drop in your paint. Most artist-grade watercolors have a code on the tube or on their website to identify whether it granulates. G = granulating, NG = non-granulating.

Give them a try. They are beautiful in a juicy watercolor painting.




Planning a watercolor palette.
