

CVWS Annual Show 2025

Yes, folks it's that time of the year when Mary Anne and I chase you or hopefully inspire you to paint for our annual show. As yet there is plenty of time but do start painting in advance, so you have some good work to submit.

Once again, we are in the wonderful surroundings of the Galen Art Center. The building is already booked with intake planned for Tuesday March 4, the evening reception on Thursday the 6th from 5-7pm, and pick up on Sunday March 9. I know many of you have generously offered to help so do mark your calendars for that week. The show will be open to the public and for sales on Thursday the 6th to Sunday the 9th. General hours are 10am to 4pm, although pick up will be at 3pm on Sunday.

The judge has been booked and most importantly the bartender for the reception! Most of our conditions remain the same, although minimum sale prices have changed. Framed pictures must be priced at a minimum of \$150 with the exception of the Mini Masterpieces at \$95 and the bin pieces at \$95 or more. We also want to upgrade the image of the bin pieces. It easy to think of the bins as a place for work that you can't sell or don't want. Let's try and go for a better quality – art that is every bit as good as your wall art but just unframed! The prices can reflect this. An all-round win!

No Risk Opportunities

Just when I felt that I had no business calling myself a painter and that I'd forgotten all I'd ever known about art, I came across a wonderful pick-me-up piece of wisdom from Australian artist, Judy Woods.

She'd been working to paint something she was happy with, but after a futile afternoon, just gave up in disgust. I quote her reflections about what she learned:

- "That you're ALWAYS capable of creating something ghastly
- When facing something ghastly WALK AWAY
- A new day can offer a new approach TRUST THE PROCESS
- Ghastliness can very quickly become LOVELY".

I immediately latched onto the first item on the list. "Hooray, I'm not alone," I thought. "Creating ghastly stuff is my forte!" So, given that I have a whole boxful of notably bad material to work with, there's no place to go but up. Everything in that box is a NO RISK opportunity. No matter which trash-worthy paper I pull out, each is equally capable of becoming a sleeping beauty, and I am free to experiment to my heart's content.

For me, experimentation is the magic key. Once I give up trying to reach perfection, I can allow myself to take risks. I've nothing invested in this disaster and so I just put on my 'Devil May Care' hat and try anything. It's like I'm starting with a clean slate. Except the slate isn't clean, so I bypass the blank white paper problem. Plus, I am already appalled by the previous results, so I don't have any fear about saving a "precious part". Perfect! I'm set to go.

I start by using black or white (either paint, collage, or gesso), covering up areas I don't like and then go about building some links between the remaining sections. Surprisingly, as I work away, some areas take on a new persona and fresh ideas start to percolate. Before you know it, I've found a path to follow and sometimes, when the muses are smiling, it turns into something I really like.

That's when I sit back, put my feet up and think smugly, "I just love being an artist."
