Andy's familiarity and love of simple farm scenes and small towns is evident in his work, as he loves to paint the landscape close to his studio in Hastings, Minnesota.

After winning an international watercolor competition through American Artist magazine, appearing on their cover in 2005, he became a sought-after workshop instructor who now paints and teaches internationally, bringing his method for simplifying watercolor to Italy, France, England, Scotland, Mexico and China. He became a signature member of the prestigious Plein Air Painters of America (PAPA) in 2012 and was elected their President in 2015.

His paintings have won numerous awards, including the Bronze Medal of Honor at the 2012 American Watercolor Society Exhibition, and in 2015 he received the High Winds Medal and his signature status from the American Watercolor Society. He is also a signature member of the National Watercolor Society and the Transparent Watercolor Society and was recently invited to join the Pure Watercolour Society in England as their only international member.

His work has also been selected for inclusion in the California Art Club's Gold Medal Exhibitions, winning the Fine Art Connoisseur Award of Excellence in 2021. His love of painting on location led to his inclusion in the 2017 Qingdao International Masters Watercolor Plein Air Event in Qingdao, China, one of 8 painting trips he's taken to China.

Andy has also juried several important exhibitions, including serving as juror of selection for both the American Watercolor Society and the TWSA Exhibitions in 2022; the Florida Watercolor Society in 2023; the California Watercolor Association in 2021, the New Jersey Watercolor Society in 2020 and the New England Watercolor Society, Philadelphia Watercolor Society and Red River Watercolor Society National Exhibitions in 2017.

<u>Participate</u> - For example, do more than attend a meeting and listen. Get involved by interacting with other members, entering painter of the month, buying raffle tickets, bringing a friend, taking a workshop, introducing yourself to someone you don't know, entering our annual show, chatting with the demonstrator, trying the "Summer Challenge", adding a painting to our Facebook page. There are many opportunities that are low risk.

<u>Volunteer</u> - Assist with a committee. Step up to fill a board position or committee chair. Involvement means that YOUR good ideas have a chance to be implemented. It also further involves you in your art community. Think of it as an endeavor that supports your well-being. Emotional health, physical health, mental health, and creative health all contribute to a longer, happier life. Being involved may entail risks, but it also offers surprising rewards.

<u>Donate</u> - Donate art books for sale, or art DVDs for the library or items for the annual show raffle baskets. Or provide monetary support. You may already support some favorite causes that ask for donations. But CVWS typically doesn't ask, so you may overlook the fact that we also need donor support. Your contributions not only ensure maintaining meetings/shows/workshops, but also allow adding new services/activities. Just saying.... Don't forget CVWS when you're feeling charitable.

We sincerely thank those who have made donations this past year and remind them that if they did not give us their mailing address, please do that, so we can send a receipt for your tax records. And if you'd like to become a donor, we will have a donations box at the Annual Show - March 7-10th. Be sure to put your donation in an envelope with your name/address so we can send you a receipt, as your support is **tax deductible**. After graduating from CSU Long Beach, she taught high school for ten years, after which she became a marketing professional with heavy responsibilities and deadlines. She and her husband of 31 years (and cat Lizzy) retired in 2013 here in Sun City at which point she began to focus full time on her art.

Marilyn works in oils, watercolors and now pen and ink. On a recent cruise to Alaska, she took an Urban sketchbook and continuously drew pen and inks of her shipmates at different venues in the ship: sipping martinis, swimming, at high tea, and playing games, leaving her with a photo essay of her new friends.





Instructions for Joining the CVWS Zoom Meeting

6:00 Social Time, 6:30 Meeting Begins

We recommend you log in 10 minutes before the meeting to get yourself set up.

ALSO Watch the YouTube Videos at the end of this page.

- 1. Zoom works best: a. Desktop Computer or b. Ipad or Tablet or c. IOS/Android Phone.
- 2. Get on your device, open your CVWS email and look for "Meeting ID#...write this number down. Then click on the link in the email that says "Join Zoom Meeting". This will take you to Zoom. If you want to listen via regular telephone (not smartphone), use any of the teleconferencing phone numbers at the bottom of the email invitation.
- 3. When Zoom opens, click Join a Meeting.
- 4. It will ask for the Meeting ID Number and Password, which will be in your email invitation. Enter your name. This identifies you to others in the meeting.
- 5. Click Join. Then Click Join With Video or Join Without Video, if you don't want others to see you.
- 6. Click Join with Computer Audio. If you don't have a microphone enabled on your device, you can type in your questions during the Q&A using the Chat feature at the bottom of your screen. If using an Android or IOS phone, tap the screen and the controls will appear. **YOU'RE IN!!**
- 7. When you enter the meeting, you will see the person that is talking on your full screen ("Speaker View"). If you would also like to see the other participants in the meeting in a grid layout, switch to "Gallery View". The controls for these are: a. Desktop Windows or Mac: On the top right of your screen. b. Ipad: On the top left. c. Android/IOS phone: Swipe left to switch from Active Speaker view to Gallery View. Keep swiping left to see more of the gallery.
- 8. Your microphone and video on/off are on the bottom left of a desktop. Tap the screen for smartphones and Ipads and the toolbar will come up. You will see icons for the microphone and video with a bar through them if they are not on. During the meeting presentations, your mic will be off unless you're called on to ask a question, and then the meeting manager will turn on your mic.
- 9. If you want to leave the meeting, click End, then Leave Meeting. There are a number of good videos that you can watch to help you use Zoom for the first time. Here are a couple:
